INTENT

Our aim at Durweston is to cover the National Curriculum for French but also to ensure that our children have:

- The confidence to speak with good intonation and pronunciation.
- The ability to read and write simple sentences.
- An awareness of the culture of France
- An interest in the French language and an enjoyment of the subject.

Equality, Diversity and Inclusion

Our curriculum planning ensures regular, progressive access to French for all KS2 children irrespective of gender, race, creed or disability.

We recognise the fact that we have children of differing ability in all our classes, and we provide suitable learning opportunities for all by matching the challenge of the task to the ability of the child. We achieve this through a range of strategies:

- setting tasks that are open-ended and can have a variety of responses;
- setting tasks of increasing difficulty, where not all children complete all tasks;
- providing a range of challenges with different resources;
- having more adults support the work of individual children or small groups

Planning

We use Twinkl for our French planning. It is organised into a 2-year rolling plan that ensures coverage of the National Curriculum and caters for our mixed-age classes.

Assessment

Marking in French should follow the school's Marking and Feedback Policy.

At the end of each unit, there is a descriptor for what all, most and some children should be able to do. This is used to input a judgement into INSIGHT, our assessment programme of Below, Just Below, ARE or Above ARE.

Resources

Monitoring and review

The co-ordination of the French curriculum is the responsibility of the French subject leader. Each term, the subject leader will monitor planning to make sure it follows the long-term plan and to support colleagues in their teaching. Work in books will be scrutinized at the end of the year, and interviews carried out with staff and pupils An action plan will be based on the findings.

This policy will be reviewed every four years.
