## Welly Walk







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#### **Uniform**

Please make sure all items of uniform are named; in fact, anything brought into school ideally should be named! You may need to check occasionally that names are still legible. We no longer have a lost property bin. Any lost items of clothing will be hung on the washing line in the school entrance. If items are not claimed they will go in the Rag bin.

Uniform with our school motif can be purchased at 'Ragtags' in Blandford. Second hand items are always available in the school reception area priced at £1 per item, with proceeds going back to the school.

Modified items are not mandatory and so you are free to source clothing elsewhere as long as it follows the guidelines set out below.

Our children wear white or pale blue shirts, blouses or polo shirts.

Both boys and girls can wear grey or black trousers or shorts; girls may also wear grey or black skirts or blue gingham summer dresses.

Our cardigans and jumpers are royal blue.

Grey or black school shoes with a bar, laces or Velcro. White, grey, black socks or tights please.

A hooded, long-sleeved waterproof coat that needs to be in school every day – we send the children out to play if it is drizzling!

A plain sun hat or cap for the summer.

We like our children to look smart and well presented, so we do ask that they don't wear big or fussy hair accessories. Long hair should be tied back so as not to get in the way when the children are working.

Stud earrings only please and one watch if necessary. This must be removed for PE and will remain the responsibility of the child. No other jewellery please apart from medical identity necklaces or bracelets.

#### PΕ

Drawstring PE bag please, not a ruck sack.

Ragtags stock our new blue PE t-shirt. These are required for all new children joining us in September. For current pupils please can we ask that when you come to change your child's PE t-shirt you buy a new branded one from Ragtags.





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Ragtags also stock an optional Durweston hoodie that children can wear for PE.

Plain black shorts, leggings, skort; optional tracksuit bottoms for cold weather. Please avoid clothing with flashes of other colours.

Trainers.

Spare, named socks.

Long hair must be tied back for PE.

Swimming kit – suitable swimming costume/trunks but <u>not</u> long or baggy shorts, swimming hat, goggles (if they like to use them) and a towel.

#### **Sundries**

A refillable, leak-proof, **named** water bottle. Bottles are available to purchase from the school office for only £2.

The rucksack should have at least two pockets: one big enough to house their reading record/reading journal and reading book and one for other stuff such as lunch box; and a hook on the top to enable it to be hung on a peg. School will provide a plastic envelope for the storage of letters.

And just repeating this as it is more important that you would imagine, please make sure all items brought into school are named so that they can always find their way back to your child.
