In order to access the teacher guides and parent videos on the website, you have to buy the text books and work books – for Durweston, this would cost £5000 (at the moment we are managing with one book per class). Clearly, this is a significant investment. And although much reduced, there would be an ongoing annual cost. At the end of the meeting, Libby Scott, Tyler in Porpoises aunt, asked to donate a substantial amount of money towards buying the scheme. We are all truly amazed, and truly grateful. She says it makes up for the cake sales she hasn't been able to organise! I am, of course, seeking funding/sponsorship from other sources – if anyone has any ideas, please let me know.

It's been a busy week for our Head Boy, Jacob Corrie and our Head Girl, Ciara Smyth. They have been showing round the potential headship candidates.
