So we think we've negotiated the IT/internet teething problems and you should all be receiving a daily email with things to do with your children. These are not new tasks; there is nothing you need to actually 'teach'. Everything the children are being asked to do is similar to tasks they will have encountered already in school. Don't let them tell you any different! We're just trying to keep all those skills going so that we'll be ready to go again as soon as we're back at school.

That is not to say that your children won't need your help! Some will need help just getting organised; others might need you to explain and perhaps help them get started; a few will need you to work alongside them. Sometimes, the easiest thing to do is to do the task yourself, talking all the time about what you're doing. This may seem odd at first! But if you can verbalise all of your thought processes, it will help your child know what to do. Remember to offer lots and lots of praise, before you choose one or two things to correct.

We think a routine is a good thing and certainly, I would suggest that you try to do some work every morning. But be flexible. If things are going well, try something else and come back to it later.

And please keep reading. I may say this every week! Not just your child reading to you, but also you reading to your child. We read to your children a lot at school: fiction, non-fiction, newspapers, poetry etc. If you can keep that up, we're already half way there!
